Politics have no place in the exam room. But Prop. 45 would change that.

Health Care Power Grab

State law established a new independent Commission, Covered California, to expand health coverage and control costs. The independent commission negotiates health plans on behalf of consumers and rejects health plans that are too expensive.

But Prop. 45 would replace this system, giving control over health plans — including benefits and treatment options, to a single Sacramento politician.


Prop. 45 gives sweeping new power over health care to the insurance commissioner, who can take millions of dollars in campaign contributions from special interests.
